# EVERYONE HAS A STORY TO TELL

Many Brewster Place residents know Bob Parman. He has lived at his lovely Birchwood Cottage for 31 years. He knows



many Brewster residents and often walks the campus and enjoys visiting with his friends.

Bob has a long reputation in the Topeka area as a kind and respected pediatrician. He says, "My whole life, I

have helped children."

Bob's life began in Grant City, Missouri in the 1920s. His mother died when he was nine years old, and his father remarried. He said that his new mother was, "a strong-willed woman."

In 1954 Bob married a nurse, Arlene, and joined the Naval Reserves in 1957. He went into active duty in 1958 in Memphis, Tennessee at Camp Lejeune.

Bob chose to go to medical school and looked toward being a pediatrician. By 1960, Bob was a resident at Children's Mercy Hospital in Kansas City and at the age of 31, he was senior resident. He joined a pediatric practice in Topeka in the early 1960s. One of his partners in this practice was fellow Brewster resident, Dr. Bart Ramsey. They continue to be great friends to this day.

Bob and Arlene grew a beautiful family. They had three children, Craig, born in 1956; Dwight, a CPA born in 1962; and Janice, born in 1967, who is a graphic artist. The Parmans also enjoyed a gathering of grandchildren. Unfortunately, Arlene passed away in 1992 of ovarian cancer. Bob said that his wife "could do anything" and proud-

ly named her a "creative woman."

Sometime later, Bob attended the Franklin Elderhostel in Nebraska for a course on Iceland. While there he met a lovely lady, Frankie. Frankie was a facilitator in Nebraska studying quilts and the stories about the people who made them. She visited Topeka and she and Bob married. They have been married for 26 years.

Happily, Bob said, "creative women have always been very important in my life."

Kind and positive, Bob said, "I have helped children all my life. I wanted to know what was in their brains. What I have done all my life is help people."

As a resident of Brewster Place, Bob has always been very involved. He has served on Resident Council, chaired the Garden Committee for many years, and volunteered at Trash & Treasure Sales and the Bazaar. Currently he volunteers his time as a desk volunteer at The Evergreens. Most importantly, Bob has been a steady support and encourager to residents, staff and board members. His words of support and kindnesses shown are valued greatly. ■

# SEVERE WEATHER SEASON

## REMINDERS TO HELP YOU PLAN FOR WEATHER EMERGENCIES

Living in Kansas means we have the potential for severe weather. Brewster has an emergency plan in place to keep residents, staff and visitors safe in case of an emergency. Please familiarize yourself with this plan not only to help yourself, but your neighbors as well.

### DEFINITIONS

#### Severe Weather Watch

Identified and issued by the Weather Service Office when severe thunderstorms or severe winter storms are likely to develop.

#### Tornado Watch

Identified and issued by the Weather Service Office when the atmosphere is favorable for the development of tornadoes. The watch is issued to alert persons to be prepared to act quickly.

#### Tornado Warning

Warnings are issued by the Weather Service Office. Civil Defense sirens are sounded and information is simultaneously broadcast over radio and television indicating that a tornado has been sighted in the area or on radar. When the warning is sounded, there is a need to immediately take cover.

### TORNADO WARNING SOUNDED

When a tornado warning is sounded, residents of Redwood, Brewster Health Center, Redwood South Assisted Living and The Evergreens will be alerted by the public address system within each building.

#### STATEWIDE TORNADO DRILL

Tuesday, March 7 at 10:00 am

Brewster's two licensed care facilities, Brewster Health Center and Assisted Living, will be participating in the drill. Independent living residents can participate on your own if you choose.

### EVACUATION PROCEDURE

#### TORNADO WARNING EVACUATION PLAN

##### Brewster Health Center and Assisted Living Residents

Staff are responsible for following the evacuation plan for residents.

##### Independent Living Residents

Residents are responsible for their own safety procedures. The following lists areas of campus and where to shelter in case of a tornado warning:

##### Redwood

Move to the nearest hallway and close apartment and fire doors.

##### North and South Terrace

Move to the North or South Terrace storage areas or to the Redwood basement area.

##### Oak, Maple & Cedar

Move to the basement of each building.

##### Stone House

Move to the basement.

##### The Evergreens

Shelter in an interior room or the Community Room.

##### Aspen and Birchwood Cottages

Shelter in the basement or interior room.

##### Grand Homes

Shelter in the basement or interior room.

##### Cottonwood Villas

Shelter in the basement storm shelter.

##### Cultural Arts Center

Shelter in the basement storm shelter. ■
