**W**ith the tick of the clock at midnight, the new year begins bringing with it hope, change, and for some of us, anxiety. January invites us to consider who we are, what we long for and what is possible. Some of us are excited by opening ourselves up to new adventures and dreaming about what the new year holds. We buy planners and journals to brainstorm our goals, strategize our ideas and set dates for our journey's embarkation. But for others, change is unexpected, maybe even unwanted. The new year feels daunting not energizing. Sometimes we resist change clinging tightly to the old life we knew so well. Routines and patterns that once worked for us now leave us exhausted and sad.

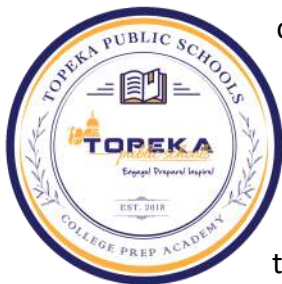

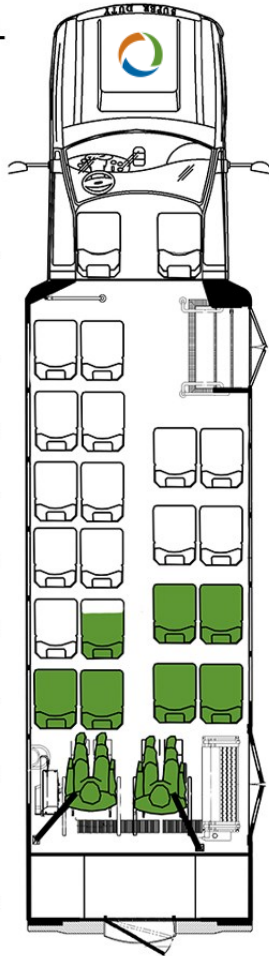
