
pus this month, please be sure to thank them for their advocacy, compassion, and kindness.

COVID-19 BOOSTER CLINIC

The CDC (Centers for Disease Control) has again recommended that anyone over the age of 65 receive a second 2024-25 COVID booster six months after the first 2024-25 vaccination. If you are interested in receiving the booster shot at Brewster Place, please stop by The Evergreens Information Center and see Sue Callen, Administrative Assistant, to get a Senior Care Rx vaccination consent form. Crystal LaFevre, Infection Control Nurse for Brewster Place, will be administering the COVID booster shots for Independent Living residents on Thursday, March 27, 2025 at 10:00 am in The Evergreens Community Room.

To Receive a COVID Booster Shot

- Pick up the Senior Care Rx Vaccination consent form from Sue at The Evergreens Info Center
- Fill out Section A and B of the consent form and sign the bottom
- If you received your fall vaccine at Brewster Place, you do not need to fill out the insurance portion of the form or present your insurance card. Senior Rx has those on file.
- If you <u>did not</u> receive your fall vaccine at Brewster Place, please fill out the insurance portion and have a copy of your insurance card made for the pharmacy to process.
- Return your consent form and copy of your insurance card to Sue by Friday, March 7.

Please note:

- Crystal must order the vaccinations two weeks prior to the clinic, so only those who submit a form by Friday, March 7 will receive a shot on March 27.
- If you miss the deadline to submit a form, you may turn it in (or fill one out) at the clinic on March 27.
 Once late forms are processed, Chrystal will order more booster shots and contact you when they have arrived.

America's Forgotten Wars

e'll examine three often overlooked conflicts in our nation's history. First, we'll focus on the undeclared 1798-1800 Quasi War with France. This maritime conflict was significant as the fledgling American Navy's baptism of fire against a foreign power, Revolutionary France. Then we'll review the American Navy's second serious conflict the war against the Barbary States (1801-1805) when President Thomas Jefferson ordered a naval expedition to the Mediterranean to curb piratical activities. Finally, we'll focus on the Spanish- American War, a fourmonth war with Spain that launched America as an international power and made national heroes of Theodore Roosevelt and his "Rough Riders."

Instructor: Robert Smith, Ph.D., is the recently retired director of the Fort Riley Museum. He has a doctorate in history from KSU and has published numerous articles on military history. ■

Solito: a Memoir by Javier Zamora

"Trip. My parents started using that word about a year ago--'one day, you'll take a trip to be with us. Like an adventure.'" Javier's adventure is a 3,000 mile journey from his small town in El Salvador, through Guatemala and Mexico, and across the U.S. border. He will leave behind his beloved aunt and grandparents to reunite with a mother who left four years ago and a father he barely remembers. Traveling alone except for a group of strangers and a "coyote" hired to lead them to safety, Javier's trip is supposed to last two short weeks. At nine years old, all Javier can imagine is rushing into his parents' arms, snuggling in bed between them, and living under the same roof again. He cannot foresee the perilous boat trips, relentless desert treks, pointed guns, arrests and deceptions that await him; nor can he know that those two weeks will expand into two life-altering months alongside a group of strangers who will come to encircle him like an unexpected family.

The true story of how the keepers of the Warsaw Zoo saved hundreds of people from Nazi hands. When Germany invaded Poland, Stuka bombers devastated Warsaw--and the city's zoo along with it. With most of their animals dead, zookeepers Jan and Antonina Żabiński began smuggling Jews into empty cages. Another dozen "guests" hid inside the Żabińskis' villa, emerging after dark for dinner, socializing, and, during rare moments of calm, piano concerts. Jan, active in the Polish resistance, kept ammunition buried in the elephant enclosure and stashed explosives in the animal hospital. Meanwhile, Antonina kept her unusual household afloat, caring for both its human and its animal inhabitants--otters, a badger, hyena pups, lynxes--and keeping alive an atmosphere of play and innocence even as Europe crumbled around her.
