Once we start the boil, it takes about an hour and a half to boil, so you can bring hand work to do during that time, go back to your apartment, or just hang around and chat. Once they are done boiling, we will lay them out to dry. This is a really fun process. And no, the paper will not fall apart.


am excited to announce that Brewster Place has filled the Director of Environmental Services role! **Tyler Baker** has accepted the position and will begin training June 9th.

BREWSTER PLACE PET POLICY REMINDER

As a community, we understand the importance of pets in the lives of our family, friends and neighbors. Pets can improve our wellness by providing emotional support and unconditional love. Brewster Place welcomes pets but there are requirements that must be met prior to bringing a pet on campus. The following information is provided to remind everyone about Brewster's Pet Policy.



A maximum of two pets is allowed per household.

A onetime non-refundable fee of \$250 per pet is required. Residents are financially responsible for any damage caused by their pets.



Residents **MUST** submit a completed pet application and receive approval from administration prior to bringing a pet to campus.



Residents **MUST** provide a current City of Topeka license, current vaccination records, and proof of liability insurance. These **MUST** be renewed on an annual basis.



All pets **MUST** be spayed or neutered.

All **visiting pets** must have proof of vaccinations. It is your responsibility to make sure the visiting pet is on a leash and cleaned up after. If staff members are required to clean up after the visiting pet, you will be billed for that service.

Your responsibility as a pet owner is as follows:

- Pet owners are responsible for immediate cleanup of waste both indoors and outdoors. If staff are required to clean up after your pet, you will be billed for that service.
- Waste must be disposed of properly in designated outdoor containers. **Do NOT** dispose of pet waste in indoor trashcans inside buildings.
- Pets must be leashed and under control at all times. Roaming freely on campus is prohibited.
- Pets are not permitted in any indoor common areas, food venues, or events where food is served.
- Residents must designate an alternate caretaker or arrange temporary pet card during their absence. If you are unable to provide care for your pet and the staff is required to do so, there will be a fee for that service.
