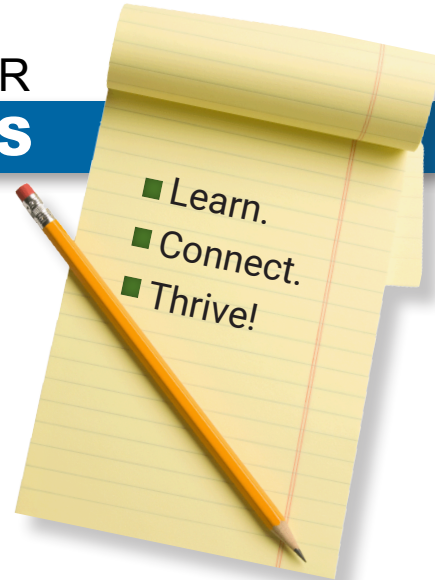

REMEMBERING THE SACRED IN A FORGETFUL WORLD

“The way you alchemize a soulless world into a sacred world is by treating everyone as if they are sacred until the sacred in them remembers.” -Sarah Durham Wilson

In a time when so much feels rushed, transactional, and disconnected, this idea lands like a soft bell ringing in a quiet room. It reminds us that the world doesn't become sacred because conditions improve. It becomes sacred because we choose to see differently.

The World Forgets—People Don't

Most people aren't walking around trying to be difficult, closed off, or unkind. They're simply carrying invisible burdens. They're tired. They're overwhelmed. They're protecting tender places that life has bruised.

When we meet someone with gentleness rather than judgment and curiosity rather than assumption, something shifts. Not just in them—in us. We stop participating in the cycle of defensiveness and begin the cycle of remembrance.

Sacredness Is Contagious

Treating someone as sacred doesn't mean putting them on a pedestal. It recognizes that beneath the layers of fear, ego, and conditioning, there is a spark; something wise, whole, and luminous.

When you treat someone as if that spark is real, they feel it. When they feel it, they soften. When they soften, they remember. And when they remember, they begin to treat others the same way.

This is how a single moment of presence becomes a ripple of transformation.

The Alchemy Is in the Small Things

Sacredness isn't found only in rituals, temples, or mountaintop revelations.

It's found in:

- The pause before responding
- The willingness to listen fully
- The choice to assume good intentions
- The courage to offer kindness first
- The patience to let someone unfold at their own pace

These are not grand gestures. They are everyday acts of spiritual rebellion in a world that often rewards speed over depth and efficiency over empathy.

Becoming a Lighthouse

You don't have to fix the world. You don't have to awaken anyone. You don't have to carry the weight of collective healing on your shoulders.

You simply choose to embody what you wish others would remember.

When you treat people as sacred, you become a lighthouse—steady, warm, and quietly transformative. You don't force anyone to change. You simply shine in a way that helps them find their way back to themselves.

A Closing Thought

If the world feels heavy, disconnected, or “soulless,” it's not a sign that humanity is lost. It's a sign that we are being invited to remember our role as alchemists.

The sacred isn't missing. It's just waiting to be recognized.

And every time you choose to see the sacred in someone else, you help them remember that it was there all along. ■

KU OSHER LIFELONG LEARNING INSTITUTE

The Life and Music of George Gershwin

Instructor: Paul Laird

Tuesdays, June 9, 23 and 30

1:00—3:00 pm | Cultural Arts Center

One of the leading musical figures in the history of the United States, George Gershwin (1898-1937) combined influences from Tin Pan Alley, classical music, jazz, and blues into a distinctive musical style heard in his numerous Broadway musicals, songs for Hollywood films, and concert works. This course explores his biography and each aspect of his musical output. Emphasis will be placed on two of his musicals (*Girl Crazy* and *Of Thee I Sing*); his opera *Porgy and Bess*; and the concert works *Rhapsody in Blue*, *Piano Concerto in F*, and the tone poem *An American in Paris*.

Instructor Bio: Paul Laird is professor of musicology at the University of Kansas. He has published widely on musical history topics including four books on Leonard Bernstein. The most recent is the biography *Leonard Bernstein in the "Critical Lives" series* from Reaktion Books (University of Chicago Press). ■
